Horace Julian Bond
January 14, 1940 – August 15, 2015

Civil rights activist Horace Julian Bond was born in Nashville, Tennessee on January 14, 1940 to Horace Mann Bond and the former Julia Washington. In 1945, Mr. Bond's father, Horace Mann Bond, became the first African-American president of his alma mater, Lincoln University and served the University until 1957. Mr. Bond lived on campus with his parents from 1945 to 1957.

Lincoln University will hold convocation on January 14, 2016 commemorating Julian Bond's life and legacy.
