To participate in Housing Selection, you must meet the following criteria:

- 1. Student must have filed their FASFA
- 2. Student must have paid their housing fee
- 3. Student must have completed the student housing application
- 4. Student must be registered full time for classes for fall 2019 (12 credits)
- 5. Student must be financially and academically cleared

Types of Room Selection:

1. <u>Return to Current Room:</u>

You must currently reside in the room you wish to retain. It is important to note that all First Year buildings are not able to participate in return to room selection. In addition, students residing in Lincoln House or Alumni House are not eligible to return to their current room. Students residing in Guest Quarters are eligible to return to Guest Quarters, however, they may be re-assigned to a different space in the building based on the needs of the Office of Residence Life. The University reserves the right to designate currently occupied rooms as unavailable. If you return to your current room, you will not be eligible to participate in general housing selection. The return to current room process is only available on Tuesday, April 16th.

Returning Room selection is as follows:

Tuesday, April 16th (12PM-5PM) in the SUB MPR.

2. General Room Selection:

All students receive a Housing Selection Lottery Number. This is a unique number within the range of the total number of current residents and is randomly generated for each current resident student. The person selecting the room must have each roommate's identification number in order to select that person as a roommate. Each roommate must also be eligible to participate in the housing selection process and must have submitted their housing application and fee on or before April 12, 2019. Roommates may choose to live together provided everyone is eligible and has a valid Housing Selection Lottery Number. The roommate with the lowest Housing Selection Lottery Number should participate in the process at the designated time. **All lottery numbers will be emailed on Tuesday, April 16th to your Lincoln University email.**

General Room Selection is as follows:

Wednesday, April 17th 12PM-5PM (SUB MPR): Lottery Numbers: 1-150

Thursday, April 18th 12PM-5PM (SUB MPR): Lottery Numbers: Any Number Higher 150

Residence Hall Options:

Male Residential Communities

- <u>Frederick Douglass Hall</u> 144 freshman males are housed on the levels.
- <u>McRary Hall</u> 119 freshmen males are housed on the two levels.

Female Residential Communities

- Lucy Laney Hall Lucy Laney Hall is a 136-bed upperclassmen residential community.
- <u>Lorraine Hansberry Hall</u> Lorraine Hansberry Hall houses freshmen females on its levels.
- <u>McCauley Hall</u> McCauley Hall is a first-year female hall located in the center of campus next to the Student Union Building.

Co-Ed Communities

- <u>Apartment Style Living</u> Apartment Style Living, or ASL, is the newest residential community on Lincoln University's campus.
- <u>Ashmun Hall</u> Transfer students will be housed in this building. First Floor will be male, second & third floor will be female.
- <u>Thurgood Marshall Living Learning Center</u> The Thurgood Marshall Living Learning Center is a multi-purpose center designed to house over 370 students.
 - LLC-North: 1st floor male, 2nd floor male, 3rd floor female (2nd & 3rd floors are part of the "Science Village" themed housing you must be a STEM major).
 - $\circ \quad LLC\text{-South: } 1^{st} \text{ floor female, } 2^{nd} \text{ floor female, } 3^{rd} \text{ floor male.}$
- <u>Rendall Hall</u> Rendall Hall is a co-ed housing community.

FREDERICK DOUGLASS HALL



Construction on Frederick Douglass Hall was completed in the summer of 1968, and opened as a male residence hall in the fall of 1968. The first floor houses a large study lounge, laundry area, and community lounge that received updates to the floor and ceilings in the summer of 2010. 144 freshman males are housed on the three upper levels, complete with newly renovated community bathrooms and trash chutes.

LORRAINE HANSBERRY HALL

Lorraine Hansberry Hall was completed in the summer of 1973. Since its opening, and to the present day, Lorraine Hansberry Hall has been used to house freshmen females on its three levels. The basement of Lorraine Hansberry Hall is also the location for the large laundry area for the residents.

LUCY LANEY HALL





Lucy Laney Hall is being used for upperclassmen and freshman ladies. Also, Lucy Laney Hall is completed with a computer lab, lounge area, laundry room, vending machines, and community bathrooms.

MCCAULEY HALL

McCauley Hall is a three-story brick building erected in 1904 as a gift from the late Dr. Thomas McCauley and Mrs. Mary D. McCauley. McCauley Hall is a first year female hall residential community with community bathrooms.





MCRARY HALL

McRary hall was originally constructed in 1956 with funds provided by the Estate of Dr. Robert B. McRary. To the present day it has been used as a male residential community. 119 freshmen males are housed on the two levels of McRary Hall, while the laundry room is located on the lower level.

RENDALL HALL

Rendall Hall was erected in 1931 and is named in honor of two former presidents of the University, Isaac N. Rendall and his nephew, John B. Rendall. The 2008 academic term brought about a change and Rendall Hall was converted to a co-ed residential community until the 2010 academic term when it was converted into an upper-class male community. It will be co-ed for fall 2019.



APARTMENT STYLE LIVING



Apartment Style Living, or ASL, is the newest residential community on Lincoln University's campus. Each suite consists of 1, 2, 4, or 5 bedrooms. A common living room area is furnished with a love seat, dining table with 5 chairs, and an end table. Suites with 4 or 5 individual rooms are accompanied with 2 bathrooms, while suites with 1 or 2 rooms, have one bathroom.
