2020 Graduating Student Survey School of Adult and Continuing Education (SACE)

SUMMARY REPORT July 2020

Mission: Lincoln University, the nation's first degree-granting Historically Black College & University (HBCU), educates and empowers students to lead their communities and change the world.

Graduating Student Survey

- Developed by the Office of Institutional Effectiveness, Research, and Planning (OIERP) in collaboration with the Alumni Relations, Career Development and SACE Student Support Services offices
- <u>Objective</u>: to collect, analyze and disseminate data regarding graduating student experiences at the School of Adult and Continuing Education.
 - The 2020 Graduating Student Survey only includes Graduate Student responses- Undergraduate students participated in a separate survey during the same time and were not asked to complete this survey.

The survey questions are categorized into:

- Student Experiences
- Plans beyond Graduation
- General Assessment of Learning
- Open Ended Questions

Response Rate

- 103 invited to participate
- 45 responses received
- 44% overall response rate

Education Plans beyond Graduation

- 68% of respondents anticipate pursuing further education
 - For those anticipating further education, PhD or Professional doctorate has the highest percentage (50%)
 - 48% plan to apply for the Bond-Hill Scholarship
 - 10% have one or more acceptances

How helpful has advice and assistance from the Lincoln University community (faculty, administration, staff, etc.) been as you make plans for next year?:

• 71% indicate the LU community was very helpful or somewhat helpful

Stay in touch with the Lincoln University community:

• 78% expect to stay in touch with faculty or staff

Lincoln Community know them well enough for recommendation:

88% feel that 2 or more faculty members know them we enough for recommendation

How has your experience at Lincoln contributed to your Knowledge, Skills and Personal Development?

- On average, 74% indicated experience at Lincoln contributed very much or quite a bit to their knowledge, skills and personal development
- The knowledge, skills, and personal development topics assessed in this survey are directly correlated with Lincoln University's Institutional Learning Outcomes (ILOs)

Conclusions & Recommendations

Accolades:

- Most respondents indicate their overall experience was excellent or good and they:
 - Would definitely or probably choose Lincoln again (82%)
 - Participated in at least one high impact practice (89%)
 - Anticipate pursuing further education (68%) and/or will be employed (100%)
 - Are comfortable with networking and identifying opportunities
- Most respondents feel:
 - Advice and assistance from Lincoln community was helpful Lincoln has contributed to their knowledge, skills and personal development
- Comments pertaining to most important outcome most often identified professional skills

Conclusions & Recommendations

Accolades (continued):

- Respondents are most satisfied with:
 - Opportunities for active and collaborative learning (93%)
 - Quality of instruction (91%)
 - Helpfulness of faculty outside of classroom (86%)
 - Feeling of security (91%)
 - Climate for gender/sexual orientation diversity (91%)
 - On site security (80%)

Conclusions & Recommendations (cont'd)

Areas of Improvement:

- Respondents are dissatisfied with:
 - Library Resources (23%)
 - Computer resources and support (21%)
 - Career development (21%)
 - Academic Advising (20%)
 - Opportunities for personal growth and development (15%)
 - Sense of community at UC (14%)
 - Availability of academic support and assistance (14%)
 - Opportunities to participate in research (13%)
 - Administration's responsiveness to concerns (11%)
