President's Report

When the PA House Appropriations Committee asked for testimony regarding remediation from presidents representing state colleges/universities, community colleges, and state-related institutions, all reports were almost exactly the same.

President has all necessary approvals for starting the designs for the new academic building.

 - Faculty passed the [Master of Education Policy on Academic Standing](#) (#3607).
 - Faculty passed the [M.S.A. Policy on Academic Standing](#) (#3607) .
 - Faculty passed [proposals for revised Visual Arts Curriculum](#).
 - The faculty also passed the [proposal for the new Honors Program](#).
 - The faculty approved the [revised MHS Policy on Incomplete Grades](#), as presented by the Educational Policies/Curriculum Committee.

Discussion Items
