


EXISTING VIEW OF STUDENT SPINE

- Activate the NS spine by placing student success programs and active ground floor uses along the spine.
- Library acts as the hinge point between Campus Core and South Campus.









SECTION THROUGH SUB PLAZA & HISTORIC QUAD

Concept for renovating the Student Union Plaza to include an ADA ramp, a terrace / amphitheater. A grid of trees is proposed to shade the plaza and the south façade of the Union.
